

Keynote Speaker: Melanie Hardy, MS, CGC, Director of Genetic Counseling at J Screen at Emory University

Melanie Hardy (she/her) is the Director of Genetic Counseling Services for the JScreen program at Emory University. JScreen provides patient-initiated clinical testing for expanded carrier screening and cancer screening to people across the US. She is manager of the genetic counseling team and works on multiple research projects along with her clinical genetic counseling duties. She has also served as a clinical supervisor to students in the Virginia Commonwealth University, Emory University, and UNC Greensboro genetic counseling programs. She graduated with a bachelor's degree in Biology from Michigan State University in 1998 and followed with a 9-year career as a high school biology, chemistry, and forensics teacher. She received a master's degree in Biology from Georgia Southern University in 2009 and a master's degree in Genetic Counseling from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro in 2011. She was certified by the American Board of Genetic Counseling in 2012. Before joining the JScreen team, Melanie worked as a prenatal genetic counselor in a Maternal Fetal Medicine clinic in Richmond, VA. Her professional interests include community outreach and education, mentorship, provision of telehealth, and enhancement of the healthcare experience.

Panelist: Laurie Flynn, MD, Surgical Oncologist, Oklahoma Cancer Specialists and Research Institute

Specializing in breast surgery, Dr. Laurie Flynn earned her medical degree from the University of Mississippi Medical Center and her bachelor's degree from the University of Mississippi. She completed her residency in general surgery at the Baptist Health System of Alabama, where she served as chief resident, and her fellowship in breast surgical oncology at the Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center; she then completed an intensive course in cancer risk assessment with the City of Hope. Dr. Flynn has been appointed as a member of the Advancement of Wellness Advisory Council by Governor Kevin Stitt and approved by the OK State Department. Previously, she served as the surgical director at the Leta Chapman Breast Center, a cancer liaison physician at St. John Medical Center and the medical director for the St. John Breast Center. She is a member of eight various scientific and medical societies and has published and spoken on a variety of topics. Dr. Flynn has also been awarded The Breast Journal Award by the American Society of Breast Disease

Dr. Michael A. Gold received his medical degree from Jefferson Medical College and completed his residency in gynecology and obstetrics at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital. After residency, he completed his fellowship in gynecologic oncology at the OU Health Sciences Center in Oklahoma City, where he remained on the faculty for nine years. He then moved to Vanderbilt University Medical Center to serve as the Director of the Division of Gynecologic Oncology. Dr. Gold is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the OU School of Community Medicine. He is active in clinical research focusing on gynecologic cancers, specifically the imaging of cervical and uterine cancer. He is an active member of the Gynecologic Oncology Group, the Society of Gynecologic Oncologists, the American Society of Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology, and the American College of Radiology Imaging Network.
