2024 Kristallnacht Art Contest

ON THE NIGHT OF NOVEMBER 9-10, 1938,

the Nazi regime coordinated a wave of violence against Jewish people, Jewish owned businesses, and Jewish places of worship in Nazi Germany. This nationwide riot became known in German as Kristallnacht, or in English, the "Night of Broken Glass." The name "Kristallnacht" is a reference to the shattered glass from store windows that littered the streets during and after the riot.

THEME - Critical Moments: The Path to the Holocaust

Students are invited to create artwork that reflects upon critical moments in Holocaust history. For example: Kristallnacht, the opening of Dachau (the first concentration camp) in 1933, Germany's invasion of Poland, The Wannsee conference, the voyage of the Saint Lewis, the Nuremberg laws...etc



All Oklahoma Middle and High School students (grades 6-12) are eligible

to enter the contest. Art teachers are encouraged to utilize the Kristallnacht art contest as a resource for meeting the Oklahoma Academic Standards for Holocaust education, specifically art and social studies standards including research.

Criteria for 2024 Kristallnacht Art Contest:

- 1. Artwork is understood to be visual art in any medium.
- 2. Artists must include a TYPED Identity Plate, Title, and short 1–3 sentence artist statement, with their artwork (see attached Identity Plate document).
- 3. The Identity Plate should appear on the artwork in a place that is not visible when displayed (such as the bottom or back of the artwork).
- 4. All artwork should be easily portable and either freestanding or able to sit on an easel or tabletop.
- 5. Artwork may be submitted by individual students or by groups of students.
- 6. Artwork that require batteries or electricity may not be displayed, for logistical reasons.
- 7. Artwork that includes the depiction of blood, body parts, or ashes will not be displayed.
- 8. Artwork will be judged based on originality, attention to detail, and evidence of historical research.
