ISRAEL ENGAGEMENT

39 educational programs—preschool through college

9 community-wide programs

2,095 total engagement

Our shaliach (Israel emissary) uses unique programming to share his Jewish heritage and knowledge with our community. Educational outreach encompassed all ages from pre-school to adults, including onsite educational programs with: Mizel Jewish Community Day School, Shul School, Camp Shalom, Midrasha, Monte Cassino Middle School, Union High School, Oral Roberts University, Northeastern State University, an adult 3-part Hebrew Learning Club, and special programs with Tulsa Global Alliance throughout the city.

New partnerships with the JCC Association of North America, the Israeli Government Ministry for Diaspora Affairs and Combating Antisemitism, and the Faces of October Seventh, helped support meaningful programs, including Yom HaZikaron, Yom HaAtzmaut, A Taste of Israel, and our October 7th Commemoration Marking One Year: A Story of Survival and Strength with Nova Festival survivor, Sagi Gabay.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS (CRC)

Combating antisemitism and advocating for Israel

The Student to Student Program brings Jewish students into the classroom, teaching peers about Judaism through personal storytelling and fighting antisemitism by making the program both personal and relatable.

8 school presentations

136 students reached

43% of student attendees had never met
a Jewish person

100% of students surveyed reported a greater
understanding of Judaism

CRC was invited back to the Gathering Place to participate in Global Gatherings, a family-friendly program that shares the cultural diversity of Tulsans. 2024 saw a 31% increase engagement at the Israel station from children and parents alike. Educating others about Israel and Jewish culture is key to combatting antisemitism.

Charles Schusterman Jewish Community Center (CSJCC)

► CAMP SHALOM

Ask any of our returning campers why they attend Camp Shalom every summer and they will tell you, “friendship, fun, and lots of pool time!” Camp Shalom is a 10-week day camp for ages 3–15 licensed by the Oklahoma Department of Health Services. Weekly themes keep campers engaged, daily swimming ensures campers are active, and weekly Shabbat services teach the songs and meaning of this weekly Jewish practice.
